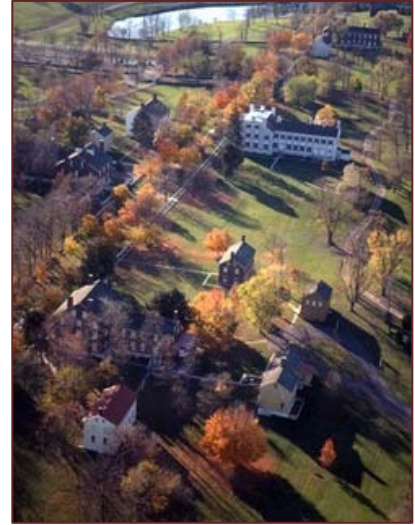




## 65<sup>th</sup> TSRC Guest Program

### Monday, September 19<sup>th</sup>: “Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill”

Following a buffet breakfast with the other guest program participants, travel through the heart of the Bluegrass back to the 19<sup>th</sup> Century to visit the Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill. The Shakers played an important role in American religious history, developing the longest lasting communal society. Their legacy is found not only in the furniture and buildings that remain at Pleasant Hill, but also in their ideals of equality, peace and love. Join in a guided walking tour of this restored community before enjoying a lunch of Shaker specialties prepared from foods produced on-site with traditional farming methods. You will also have an opportunity to browse the shops of the Shaker Village featuring a plethora of wares from local craftsmen.



After lunch, board a coach for a short ride to Shaker Landing to enjoy a relaxing afternoon aboard the “Dixie Belle” riverboat. Cruise the scenic Kentucky River palisades, along a stretch of river with high limestone cliffs and untouched natural beauty. Along the way, the guide will describe the river's diverse ecosystem and the historical importance to the Shakers.

The afternoon will conclude with a scenic return trip to the Hyatt Regency.

### Tuesday, September 20<sup>th</sup>: “Race Course and Thoroughbreds”

Begin your day with breakfast with the others in the guest program, then depart for the Keeneland Race Course just outside Lexington. Host to the internationally famous Thoroughbred racing and auctions, Keeneland’s facility and grounds are breathtaking in both their timelessness and beauty. Join a walking tour of the grounds followed by a stop at the Keeneland Sales Pavilion. This is the site of the world’s largest Thoroughbred Yearling Auction, which will be in progress when you arrive. Your guide will explain the process while you watch the money flowing after the beautiful young horses in the sales ring.



The afternoon will continue with a visit to Ashland, the Henry Clay Estate. The home of Kentucky’s most famous son, Ashland is a National Historic Landmark and site of profound history. At the front door a guide will welcome you on a journey through the Clay family mansion, as time travel in time from the 18th century to the present. Lunch will be served at the Ginkgo Tree Cafe — in the shade of Ashland’s historic trees, among the geraniums and fragrant gardenia bushes — the perfect complement to your Ashland visit.

You will have free time to stroll the beautiful gardens of Ashland or visit the gift shop before returning to the Hyatt Regency.
